San Cristóbal de Las Casas Chiapas, México https://chiapasphoto.org Desde 1992 el Proyecto Fotográfico de Chiapas (CPP, por sus siglas en inglés) ha proveído a los pueblos indígenas mayas de Chiapas oportunidades para expresarse culturalmente y artísticamente a través de la fotografía.

Since 1992 the Chiapas Photography Project (CPP) has provided indigenous Maya peoples of Chiapas with opportunities for cultural and artistic self-expression through photography.

Carlota Duarte initiated the Chiapas Photography Project (CPP) in 1992 to offer photography education to Maya peoples in the state of Chiapas. Indigenous communities in Mexico have long been photographed and represented by outsiders. From its beginnings CPP, in the interest of social justice, has offered the native peoples of Chiapas basic training and opportunities to use photography for their own ends. Several hundred men and women from many ethnic groups, political and religious backgrounds have participated; many have undertaken projects that include members of their communities. Activities have been provided for children as well.

The Project's activities are both local and global in scope. Based in San Cristóbal de Las Casas, the commercial and cultural center of the Chiapas Highlands, workshops take place principally in the participants' communities which also host exhibitions and other activities involving the participants. Additional public activities take the form of publications, exhibitions in museums, galleries, and alternative spaces in Mexico and abroad. The work has been covered in the Mexican and international press, received critical attention and been discussed in books, articles and in academic venues and research.

In 1996 CPP developed the Archivo Fotográfico Indígena (AFI) at CIESAS-Sureste, an academic research center in San Cristóbal de Las Casas. In addition to the Individual Award to Carlota Duarte from 1995 to 2001, the Ford Foundation supported AFI from 1996 to its 2006 conclusion, and continued support for CPP through 2012.

The CPP staff of indigenous photographers maintains the office, training program, photography collection, and develops exhibitions, publications and other material, and carries out public activities in Mexico and abroad. Opportunities are provided for volunteers to work with staff and participants.

In 2018 Stanford University Special Collections acquired the Chiapas Photography Project collection. Each year supplements related to continuing CPP activities are added to the collection.
