

Sister Muriel C. Heide, R.S.C.J.

who taught English as a Second Language classes in New York City, Peru and South Korea, died May 22 at Kenwood Convent of the Sacred Heart in Albany. She was 89. Born in New York City, she entered the Society of the Sacred Heart in 1935. She taught at schools in New York, Connecticut and Massachusetts until she was assigned in 1964 to Lima, Peru, where for eight years she prepared young women for a teaching certificate in English at the National Teachers Institute for Women. She also taught English at a women's college in South Korea in the early 1980s. From 1984 to 1994, she taught English to Hispanic residents of New York City in a program run by the Little Sisters of the Assumption. She is survived by three sisters, Ruth Kane, Constance Sullivan and Anne Quigley, and a brother, [Father Edward Heide] of Azul, Argentina. She was predeceased by her brother Msgr. Herman L. Heide, a priest of the archdiocese who was pastor emeritus of Our Lady of Loretto parish in Cold Spring. A Funeral Mass was offered
